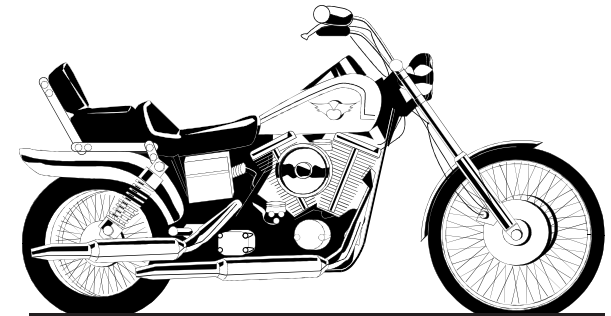

Riding a motorcycle takes special skills that you don't want to learn the hard way. Try the Motorcycle Rider Education Course at Northeast Community College instead. Motorcycle courses for beginning and experienced riders are conducted because motorcycling is a lot more fun – and a lot safer – when you have the skills and strategies to handle your bike in traffic. There are other benefits as well. Course graduates may be eligible for lower insurance rates. Upon presentation of course certificate participants are eligible to **waive the written and riding test** when obtaining their motorcycle endorsement on their **Nebraska driver's license**.

Motorcycle Rider Course (Riding and Street Skills)

The Motorcycle Rider Course includes five hours of classroom instruction and ten hours of riding instruction. It begins with the basics, such as turning, shifting, and braking. Then it moves on to more advanced street riding strategies. Professionally trained instructors teach in the classroom and then coach riders in a controlled riding area.

If you are under 18, a parent or legal guardian must sign the required waiver form. In order to pass, you must attend all classroom and riding sessions and **pass the knowledge and skills test**.

What to bring: The Motorcycle Rider Course provides the motorcycles. You may bring your own helmet, if you don't have one, one will be provided. You must bring a valid driver's license, learner's or school permit, pen or pencil, and a note pad.

Clothing: You also need to **wear long sleeves and pants, shoes or boots that cover your ankles** and have low heels, full-fingered gloves, eye protection, and **rain gear** if the weather is threatening.

Cost: The fee is \$144.51 for Nebraska residents with a Nebraska Driver's License. Fees for students with out-of-state licenses will be \$167.76. The fee is subject to change.

How to Register for Course:

Application and registration must be processed before course starts. A current application on file is required before students may register for the course. Enrollment is limited and courses fill quickly, so register early. Please call (402) 844-7265 or (402) 844-7266 for registration information or visit our website at www.northeastcollege.com to apply and register online.

Students may use a credit card to pay online at the time of registration or call the Northeast Community College Business Office, (402) 844-7001, to request payment on their account. Any credit card payment made via the telephone will not be reflected on the student's account until the next business day.

Students may send their payment by mail. Students, who choose to mail their payment of tuition and fees, should allow sufficient time for their payment to reach the Business Office.

Upon payment in full, your registration will be confirmed and you will receive specific course information. Registration fee is non-refundable.
