

Additional Scholarship Opportunities

Each of these scholarships requires a separate *application form and deadlines may vary*. Applications are located on the racks outside the Financial Aid Office unless otherwise noted.

Admissions Academic Scholarship for freshmen only

Qualifications:

- 1) Must have a composite score of 24 or above on the ACT
- 2) Must have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.75 or above
- 3) Must submit documentation of the ACT scores and GPA
- 4) Must be a U.S. citizen

AK-SAR-BEN for freshmen and sophomores

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be able to demonstrate financial need by submitting a Federal Student Aid Report (SAR) along with the application form
- 2) Must be accepted for admission or enrolled at an eligible community college
- 3) Must be a United States citizen who is a resident of Nebraska or western Iowa
- 4) Must enroll as a full-time student (at least 12 credit hours)
- 5) Current high school students must attach a high school transcript

Ambassador Scholarship for freshmen and sophomores

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be 18 years of age
- 2) Must be currently enrolled at Northeast
- 3) Must maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA during each semester of enrollment
- 4) Must have excellent verbal communication skills
- 5) Must have a positive attitude toward Northeast Community College and the desire to help others
- 6) Must be willing to serve as a student ambassador for at least one academic year

American Chemical Society for freshmen and sophomores

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be enrolled in a chemical science program of study, which includes chemistry, biochemistry, chemical engineering, materials science, and environmental science
- 2) Must be African American, Hispanic/Latino, or American Indian
- 3) Must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident of the U.S
- 4) Must be a full-time student at an accredited college, university, or community college
- 5) Must have a 3.0 cumulative GPA
- 6) Must be able to demonstrate financial need according to the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be a regularly enrolled, full-time freshman student

- 4) Must show financial need

Qualifications:

- 5) Must be the only family member presently receiving a grant from The Susan Thompson Buffett Foundation

- 3) Preference given to students with current membership in the NECC Computer Information Processing Club
- 4) In addition to a scholarship application, a transcript, resume, non-academic reference, and additional essay is required

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be planning a career in the food service industry and major in a food service related field of study
- 2) Must be enrolled at an institution that is a member of the National Association of Colleges & University Food Services
- 3) Must be enrolled in an undergraduate program full time, in good standing, and have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher
- 4) Must be a U.S. or Canadian citizen and must attend college in the U.S. or Canada during the scholarship award year
- 5) Must submit a transcript from all colleges attended
- 6) Scholarship must be used for academic purposes such as tuition, fees, room and board, and/or books

- 2) Must have a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher (a progress report for the current semester will be required of finalists)
- 3) Must be present at the April student achievement awards program

Faith Regional Health Services – ADN for 2nd semester sophomores

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be enrolled at Northeast Community College
- 2) Must have successfully completed one semester of the Northeast associate degree of nursing program and be committed to completing the program

Faith Regional Health Services – LPN for 2nd semester freshmen

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be enrolled at Northeast Community College
- 2) Must have successfully completed one semester of the Northeast practical nursing program and be committed to completing the program

Hispanic Scholarship Fund for freshmen and sophomores

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be of Hispanic heritage
- 2) Must be a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident
- 3) Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
- 4) Must apply for federal financial aid using the FAFSA

ISA Educational Foundation for freshmen and sophomores

Qualification:

- 3) Four year degree program applicants must be in their sophomore year or higher of their study or its equivalent at the time of application

Qualification:

- 1) Must be enrolled in Rural Agribanking
- 2) Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher

Qualifications:

- 1) Must qualify as a displaced homemaker or single parent

- 4) Must be a member of Phi Theta Kappa/Tau Chi Chapter
- 5) Must turn in essay with application

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be a woman at least 35 years of age as of March 1, 2009
- 2) Must be a U.S. citizen
- 3) Must be pursuing a technical/vocational degree, an associate degree, or a first bachelor degree
- 4) Must be enrolled or accepted in an accredited school for the fall of 2009

- 4) Must continue education at any accredited college in the field of education

DEADLINE: February 1, 2009

Davis-Chambers Scholarship for sophomore transfer students only

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be a member of a racial, ethnic, or cultural group
- 2) Must be a graduate of an accredited high school located in the State of Nebraska
- 3) Must be planning to enroll as a full-time undergraduate student at Chadron, Peru or Wayne State College in the fall of 2009
- 4) Must have a 3.0 GPA
