**CONFIRM YOUR COURSE SELECTIONS WITH THE CONCORDIA
UNIVERSITY REGISTRAR'S OFFICE.**

Students anticipating transferring to Concordia University may use this guide for selecting Northeast Community College courses. Students should communicate frequently with the Concordia University Registrar Office to confirm course selections.

Students are required to meet the specific hours in each area of these general education requirements. The minimum number of hours may be exceeded depending on the courses the student chooses.

To be admitted, transfer students must be in good standing and have a 2.00 higher grade point average on a 4.00 scale at the institution from which they are transferring. A maximum of 70 semester hours (105 quarter hours) will be accepted for transfer from a community college.

Within the hours required for graduation each student completes a program of 44 hours of general education. This component of Concordia's curricula is a basic liberal education that seeks to broaden and develop people who are socially and religiously sensitive, who see the interrelatedness of learning between the disciplines, who are culturally aware, physically and intellectually rounded and more capable of coping with the demands of life.

1. English-Communication-Theatre Arts Requirements- 6 hours
 - ECTA 104 (3 hours) - ENGL 1010 AND SPCH 1110. This course is a combination of composition and speech.
 - ENG 201 (3 hours) - ENGL 2100

2. Social Science Requirements- 9 hours
 - History (3 hours)
Students can select one of the following:
HIST 115 - HIST 2020
HIST 131 - HIST 1050
HIST 132 - HIST 1060
 - Social Sciences (6 hours)
Course work from two of the following areas: economics, geography, political science, sociology and psychology. Course selected from:
ECON 101 - ECON 2110 OR ECON 102 - ECON 2120
GEOG 101- No NECC course meets this requirement OR GEOG 102 -
GEOG 1020
PS 111 - POLS 1000

PSY 101 - PSYC 1810
SOC 101 - SOCI 1010

3. Mathematics Requirement- 3 hours
Elementary Education students take MATH 201 unless completing MATH 182 or higher.
- MATH 132 – MATH 1150
 - MATH 182 – MATH 2050
 - MATH 184 – MATH 2000
 - MATH 186 – MATH 2010
 - MATH 222 – MATH 2030
 - MATH 284 – MATH 2020
- Additional course(s) that could be taken at Concordia to fulfill this requirement: MATH 142, 151, 175, 201 or 252
4. Science Requirements - 6 hours
The goal of the general education science requirement is to provide exposure to the major disciplines of science. Students must complete at least one course each in biology, chemistry and physics between high school and college. Students who have taken courses in two or more of the above areas in high school may take coursework in space, earth or other sciences. The following courses are recommended for students who are not in science programs:
- BIO 110 – BIOS 1010
 - BIO 444 – HOEC 1050
- Additional course(s) that could be taken at Concordia to fulfill this requirement: BIO 201, 217, 222, 243, 288, 362, 363 or 385
- CHEM 115 – CHEM 1140
- Additional course(s) that could be taken at Concordia to fulfill this requirement: CHEM 109
- PHYS 109 – PHYS 1130
 - PHYS 110 – PHYS 1140
- Additional course(s) that could be taken at Concordia to fulfill this requirement: SCI 202, 281, 315, 331, 365 or 381.

In addition, students in science programs or other students with strong interest may use the following courses to fulfill general education science requirements. Students not in science programs are strongly encouraged to consult with the instructor before registering for these classes.

- BIO 141 – BIOS 1050
- BIO 208 – BIOS 2170
- BIO 343 – BIOS 2110
- BIO 344 – BIOS 2120

5. Fine Arts Requirements- 3 hours
- ART 101 – No NECC course meets this requirement. Elementary education students are required to take ART 101 unless they have art concentrations or art minors.
 - ART 203- ARTS 1250
 - CTA 151 – THEA 1100
 - CTA 152 – THEA 1340
 - CTA 299 – THEA 1310
 - MU 101 – MUSC 1550
 - MU 232 or MU 233– Courses in the chorus and ensemble groups
 - MU 242 – Courses in the band and orchestra groups
 - Any applied Music course – Individual instructions in Voice, Brass, Woodwinds or Piano
- Additional course(s) that could be taken at Concordia to fulfill this requirement: Art 101 or 260, CTA 154, or 231, MU 236, 237, 241, 242, 244, 245, 246 or 247.
6. Health and Human Performance Requirements- 2 hours
- The 2 hours includes HHP 100 and 1 hour activity course.
- HHP 100 – HPER 1500
 - 1 hour activity, health topics or First Aid & CPR – Please refer to the Concordia catalog for choices in this area.
7. Theology Requirements- 6 hours
- REL 121 and REL 131 – These are Concordia University courses designed to expose the student to the historical and theological survey and writings of the Old and New Testament.
8. General Studies- 9 hours
- GS 101 – No NECC course meets this requirement. Required during the freshman year. (Waived for students entering with 24 or more hours earned as a full-time college student).
 - GS 201 – No NECC course meets this requirement. Required during the sophomore year.
 - GS 301 – No NECC course meets this requirement. Required during the junior year.
 - GS 401/THEO 489 - No NECC course meets this requirement. Required during the senior year.
